

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



Appraisal – clarification of GMC role 1



- Delivery of appraisal is a matter for boards
- We have guidance on the supporting information:
 - CPD
 - any complaints or compliments
 - significant events
 - feedback from patients and colleagues (every 5 years)
 - quality improvement activities (every 5 years)

Appraisal – clarification of GMC role 2



Supportive and developmental

Employers and Royal Colleges may set additional requirements

Local appraisal guidance

We do not require use of any specific systems

Appraisal - Covid Update

- We had no role in decisions to suspend or re-start appraisal
- We supported the temporary suspension of appraisal
- We supported rebalancing appraisal
- We have allowed revalidation if an appraisal(s) missed due to pandemic if evidence exists from previous appraisals

Revalidation

- Supports doctors to reflect on development
- Gives patients confidence that doctors are up to date and fit to practise
- Promotes improved quality of care by driving improvements in clinical governance

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Revalidation – Covid Update

- Option to defer revalidation. Deferral a neutral act
- Doctors can revalidate if miss appraisal(s) if supporting information discussed at earlier appraisals
- ROs can make recommendations any time up to any rescheduled dates
- Introduced flexibility in how doctors gather feedback from their patients
